## Review: last year's aims and outcomes

To ensure all pupils in mixed age classes have access to high quality teaching.	All pupils are catching up from Covid learning loss. Creating extra class (mornings only) for Years 2 and 3 to decrease class sizes and age ranges
To ensure that all staff are trained to deliver high quality phonics	Internal phonics screening showed 83% pass rate for Year 2 PSC
