I am very sad to inform you that Mrs Kyte will be leaving us after Easter. She has been offered another job where she can work from home and is keen to take it.

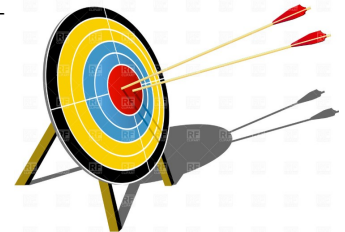
We will let you know as soon as possible who will be replacing Mrs Kyte in classes 1 and 2.



NO Book Club—Next Monday:

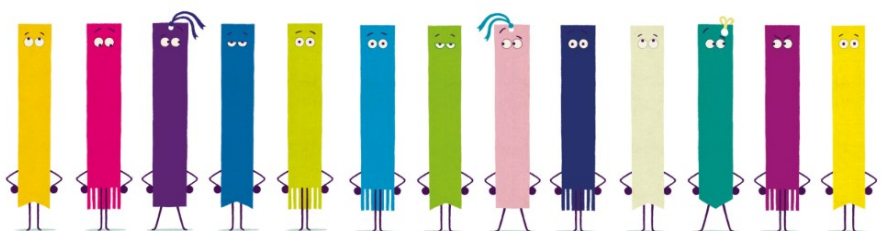
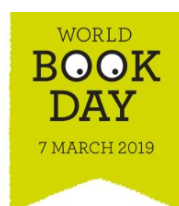
Next week there is an archery tournament on Monday 11th, so book club will not be running as Mr Stinchcombe will be taking the children.

So proud of the campaigning and common sense children at Furlanesend, our local primary school, who have received a great letter of support from Sir David Attenborough after deciding NOT to use red plastic noses for the BBC's Comic Relief this year. The noses cost £1.25 but Comic Relief gets just 65 pence of this, while the noses are just another form of unnecessary plastic that will eventually end up in landfill or in the environment. Instead, Furlanesend children will be paying £1.25 to paint their noses red - and Comic Relief will get ALL of this money. The school wrote to BBC Comic Relief to ask them to make this the last year they will use the noses and other single-use plastic merchandise to raise funds.... which seems especially outdated after the BBC's Blue Planet II did so much to raise public awareness about the environmental impact of plastic pollution. Sir David told the children in his letter that the children were 'perfectly correct to raise the question of replacing plastic products wherever we can' and that he hoped they would receive an 'adequate reply' from Comic Relief - but the letter from them was sadly lacklustre and vague. Some other schools in Cornwall and the north have already decided to join Furlanesend in taking a stance against the plastic noses. If you're a teacher, a pupil or a parent maybe you can speak to your school about doing the same thing?!
